Report on the Administration of the Access to Information Act for the period 2024-04-01 to 2025-03-31

1. Introduction

The St. John's Port Authority (SJPA) was established pursuant to the *Canada Marine Act* (CMA), which received Royal Assent on May 1, 1999. The CMA repealed the Canada Ports Corporation Act of 1983.

The SJPA's mission is to provide consistently valuable, innovative and efficient port services that foster trade, regional growth, and provincial success.

The Access to Information Act (ATIA) provides Canadian citizens, permanent residents, and individuals and corporations present in Canada a right to access records under the control of government institutions, in accordance with the principles that government information should be available to the public, that necessary exceptions to the right of access should be limited and specific, and that decisions on the disclosure of government information should be reviewed independently of government.

This report is prepared and tabled in Parliament in accordance with section 94 of the *Access to Information Act*.

This report covers the fiscal year 2024-04-01 to 2025-03-31.

2. Organizational Structure of the Access to Information Office

The responsibility for processing requests received under the *Access to Information Act*, as well as responsibility for ensuring that each proactive publication requirement is met, *rests* with the President and Chief Executive Officer, who ensures compliance with the legislation.

Administration of the *Access to Information Act*: The staff complement at the SJPA is 14. The President and CEO is the Access to Information Coordinator. The Vice President, Finance & Administration is the Authorizing Representative. The Executive Assistant is an Officer. Procedures for handling Access to Information requests, as well as proactive publications, are well known throughout our institution.

The SJPA has not entered into any new service agreements under section 96 of the *Access to Information Act* during this reporting period.

For a breakdown of the group(s) and/or position(s) responsible for meeting each applicable proactive publication requirement under Part 2 of the *Access to Information Act*, see the section "**Proactive Publication under Part 2 of the ATIA**" in section 9 of this report.

3. **Delegation Order**

The Access to Information Coordinator is Mr. Sean Hanrahan, President and Chief Executive Officer, who is the head of our institution. There has been no further delegation by the President and CEO setting out the powers, duties and functions for the administration of the *Access to Information Act*. The President and CEO ensures that any requests are processed in accordance with the provisions of the Act.

4. Performance 2024-2025

The SJPA received one request during the 2024-2025 fiscal year. This request was completed within 1-30 days and was 'all disclosed'.

There were consultations with the Office of the Information Commissioner of Canada and other organizations outside of the Government of Canada on one, of two, outstanding requests from the 2021-22 reporting period. Both outstanding requests from 2021-22 were closed at the end of the reporting period.

There were no active requests at the end of the reporting period.

In the past fourteen years, a total of twelve requests have been received, averaging less than 1 request per year. All completed requests were finalized in under 30 days, not costing more than \$250.00 each. Previous exemptions invoked; s.20(1)(b),(c) on the 2010 & 2011 requests; s.20(1)(b) on the 2013; s.21(1)(a),(b) on the 2011 request; s.18(a), 19(1), 20(1)(a), (b),(c), (d), and 21(a), (b) on the 2021 requests and s.18(b) on the 2010 request. Given the limited number of Access to Information requests received at the SJPA, no identifiable trends have been established.

5. Training and Awareness

During the 2024-2025 reporting period, SJPA's Access to Information staff participated in: Invitation to the New ATIP Professionals Onboarding Session on April 4, 2024 and September 18, 2024; APCDO 'Ask Me Anything' on Statistical Reports 2023-24 on June 20, 2024; Access to Information and Privacy Communities Meeting on September 25, 2024; APCDO InfoBlitz – Consequences of Obstructing the Right to Access on November 27, 2024; APCDO Deep Dive – Access to Information and Information Management: the Duty to Document and Information Management Practices on December 18, 2024; APCDO Infoblitz – Guidance on the Use of Generative Artificial Intelligence on January 24, 2025; APCDO Deep Dive Series – Personal Information Banks on January 31, 2025; and APCDO Deep Dive: ATIA Section 19/Privacy Act Section 26 – Personal Information on February 26, 2025.

6. Policies, Guidelines, Procedures, and Initiatives

The SJPA posts all requests, and monthly summaries of same, through the Open Government portal. For reference, a link to the portal summaries of Access to Information requests can be found here: Completed Access to Information Requests | Open Government - Government of Canada

The SJPA is a Government Business Enterprise and proactively discloses travel and hospitality expenses on a monthly basis. In addition, reports tabled in Parliament are proactively disclosed as required. The SJPA did not implement any new or revised institution-specific policies, guidelines and procedures related to access to information during the reporting period.

7. Initiatives and Projects to Improve Access to Information

There were no initiatives or projects undertaken in this reporting period. Given the low number of requests, SJPA continually evaluates opportunities to improve efficiencies in ATIA processes as requests arise.

There were no access to information complaints received by the SJPA during the reporting period, therefore there were no key issues raised or actions taken.


